6 **Regular Meeting, Wednesday, September 21st 2005**

8 President Hinton called the Senate to order at 7:30 PM

10 **Opening Roll Call**

12 There were thirty-six (36) Senators (Adams, Barnes, Brannan, Cariaga, Carter, Collins,
13 Compton, Fabricius, Gardner, Gluck, Griggs, Haggard, Hankins, Heath, Hoy,
14 Hutcherson, Lam, Mckethan, Melton, Musick, Oluronbi, K. Phillips, Rice, Salama,
15 Santiago, Saunders, Shaw, Shivers, Langlely for Stephenson, Templeton, Walton,
16 Weston, Whitehouse, Winfree, Wood, Yasin) present. There was also one (1) non-voting
17 member (Toms) present.

19 There were eleven (11) Senators (Chamblee, E. Evans, M. Evans, Godfrey, Hardy, M.
20 Lloyd, Moye, Sevits, R. Smith, Sohail, and Waldrup) absent. There was also one (1) non-
21 voting member (F. Hinton) absent.

22 The following official was also present: Piavis.

25 **Receipt of Petitions and Correspondence:**

27 - Mr. Charles Meeker, Mayor of Raleigh

28 General notes: (we) Need to look at the noise ordnance, as was from a time when
29 there were problems with Brent rd. We can have a party, just needs to be in the
30 correct place.

31 Improved student perceptions: I like the current perceptions. Some times there are
32 neighborly issues but by in large the folks here in Raleigh are happy with the students
33 in the area. 30% of the students, who attend here, will stay here.

34 Spoke about the Hillsborough street projects, the plan for 7 round-abbots. Brought up
35 that we need expanded public transportation to serve Raleigh.

37 **Q/A:**

39 Sen. Hutcherson: Question about the lights across Hillsborough, for people with
40 disabilities. (Length issue)

41
42 A: We can look at specific cases, but this is part of the bond issue coming up.

43 Sen. Hoy: Roundabouts. It is not wide enough,

44
45 A: Instead of making it wide we are planning to make it smaller, slow the traffic down
46 and make it more pedestrian friendly.

47 Sen. Hoy: In my area there are problems. (with crime)
48
49 A: I was speaking in general, our crime is relatively low.
50 Sen. Hoy: Water shortage?
51
52 A: Voluntary water - the reserve is down 1-1.5 feet. We have enough water for 4 months
53 without any rain.
54
55 Q: asked about getting businesses to invest in Hillsborough St.
56
57 A: we are looking into working on getting the environment better.
58
59 Q: Student issues coming up?
60
61 A: no big issues coming up.
62
63 - Mr. Paul Cousins, Director of Student Conduct
64 Varieties of issues with the judicial branch. Used to be a peaceful co-existence. In the
65 past 1/2 a dozen years it has gotten less amiable. It is my intent to seek a severance of
66 the judicial branch to make it an offshoot of the office of student conduct. What does
67 this mean for students? The code of conduct is a robust and ever changing code. I
68 don't anticipate the process changing much. It will still work with a judicial executive
69 who is elected. There are issues with finances and offices. We are looking into who
70 makes the decision for these issues. The office of student conduct is willing to take on
71 the expenditures for the judicial branch. I think there are only positive things to be
72 gained from this split.

76 Sen. Hutcherson: Funding for integrity week, will it be provided by the office of student
77 conduct?
78
79 A: It will.
80 Sen. Fabricius: Short term - vs. - large term | Should we have confirmations of the rest of
81 the assistants.
82
83 A: The governing docs do not require confirmations. So table the confirmations
84 indefinitely.
85 Sen. Fabricius: issue of money
86
87 A: All the current members would go without if Student Government stopped their funds
88 currently.
89 Sen. Hoy: What is the relationship between the graduate school and office of student
90 conduct.
91

92 A: Goes from the spectrum of having a hearing to passing the items back to the graduate
93 school depending on the severity.
94 Sen. Compton: What do you see as the future board. As more splitters are created how is
95 this going to fit into the plan.
96
97 A: Dispute the calling of the Judicial Board as mine. I don't control it. Its not mine.
98 Where would they go with the new model, they would go forward in the same fashion.
99 Support would be different, even more.
100 Sen. Hutcherson: Judicial Board has held on by a string. Did not happen until Jeffrey
101 Vizcaino. Explain why told him not to come down.
102
103 A: This is only the most recent case. Only two appropriate answers, you heard both
104 answers that night. It is part of our internal selection. The 2nd answer is higher ethically.
105 My response was you have all you needed to do. You have already answered to all the
106 people. It was just to make him jump through hoops. And I advised him to not attend.
107 They are not political, they are more of a service. And in fact did not matter.

141 Sen. Walton: Why did you sign this unprofessionally?
142
143 A: I was gonna make it all professional like, but being that I did not have the time for
144 that, I did the doodling.
145
146 Q: Could you provide professional letters?
147
148 A: No.
149
150 Q: Could you appoint a translator.

152 A: There will be someone appointed.
153
154 Q: The quotes in the technician were in English, could you provide us the same.

156 A: They asked questions when I was not expecting it.
157
158 Q: Board of trustees, questioned his support for an increase in tuition.
159
160 A: There were things I can't talk about. Financial issues. quite a swell meeting.
161 Fabricius: Risk that your remarks to the boards will be taking as students support a rise in
162 tuition.

164 A: Not calling for a tuition increase.

166 Q: do you wear your pirate outfit with the trustees.

169 Sen. Hoy: How do you characterize your relationship with the NC Legislation and the
170 Alumni.

291 not to back down from the balking of some of the appointments. I advised him to change
292 his approach for the veto.
293 Sen. Walton: You were a member of the 85th session and once you lost the pro temp
294 position and then resigned.

442 P: Sen. Hoy: At other universities are required to post this. This sends a message that
443 there is a problem. Not the bill that is important, but the message.
444
445 N: Sen. Loyde: As recently as today, I had a teacher not come. He sent us a message,
446 afterwards. I was not upset that he has a emergency. Our teachers are professionals.
447
448 P: Sen. Salama: The faculty senate meeting did not have anything negative to say about
449 this bill.
450
451 N: Sen. Yasin: I spoke in favor of this bill last time. I asked the CoT about the bill, and
452 we took a vote and they said they did not want us to override the bill.
453
454 P: Sen. Walton: CoE we are for this bill, this is only a suggestion for the provost. He
455 would be happy to help us move along, even though he was neutral.
456
457 N: Sen. Mickey: The bill says 45 minutes before class.
458

459 P: Sen. Fabricius: What is the impact. It is just a recommendation. If this legislation was
460 policy it would be bad. But it's just a recommendation, the wording and actual policy
461 would be different.

462

463 N: Sen. Waldrup: I am military minded. Effective in your flexibility. Just work face to
464 face with professors.

465

466 P: I tried to ask the president what his objections were. He did not answer this. We are
467 expected to be professional. The professors should treat us the same.

469 N: Sen. Diamond: Spoke with constituents. This is a waste of our time. There are more
470 pressing matters. We should move on.
