5 There were forty (40) Senators (Adams, Barnes, Bellamy, Brannan, Cariaga, Carter, Collins, Compton,
6 Culp, Dimond, Douglas, Fabricius, Gardner, Griggs, Gula, Haggard, Hankins, Heath, Hughes,
7 Hutcherson, M. Lloyd, Lofvenholm, Long, McArthur, Mickey, Moye, Musick, Norman, K. Phillips,
8 Santiago, Saunders, Sevits, R. Smith, Templeton, Waldrup, Wally, Walton, Whitehouse, Winfree, Yasin)
9 present. There were also two (2) non-voting members (F. Hinton, Toms) present.

10
11 There were fifteen (15) Senators (Maria Evans, Gluck, Godfrey, Hager, Hoy, Kelly, Kersh, Kling,
12 Mckethan, Miller, Oluronbi, Sawrey, Shivers, J. Washington, Wilburn) absent. There was also one (1)
13 non-voting member (Murden) absent.

14
15 The following official was also present: Piavis.

16
17 A quorum was present.
18
19

20 Chief Younce: [Read mission of Campus Police]. Our job is to assist you in keeping a safe
21 campus. In regards to the 7 students that were arrested. The offences included stealing and
22 reselling textbooks among other criminal activity. The young lady who got shot at was
23 tremendously lucky since the bullet did not penetrate the skin.
24

25 I want to speak with you in regards to the resolution. I don't know if you realize this or not, but
26 the majority of the assaults that occur on campus are between people who know each other.
27 Most of the thefts are due to various cases of student negligence.
28

29 The non-student who was stealing books would be let into the residence hall, and go door to door
30 finding those unlocked and unoccupied, entering and stealing property. Someone had to have let
31 him in.
32

33 We can not offer you complete security, but we can offer many officers and support. Regarding
34 patrols, we provide them regarding the demand for service in the area. The more calls we
35 receive in a given area, the more often we will patrol the area and in areas we don't have much
36 activity in, we don't
37

38 We have walking patrols from midnight to 2am on Fraternity Court, in walking patrols, amongst
39 other places. Wolf Village especially.
40

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41 Two or three years ago you started a CSI program, we provided support; radios, etc. It went
42 downhill due to lack of student involvement. The Technician recommended it, but without
43 student involvement is a problem.

44
45 Your chances of being involved in a serious crime goes up seven times when you leave the area
46 of campus.

47
48 We have 318 blue lights and telephones in elevators. To add a blue light costs \$25,000. Once a
49 month the telephones are physically checked. The police office checks them but doesn't service
50 them. Facilities are involved in that role.

51
52 We will be going 911 next semester, so that you don't have to remember 5-3333 anymore. We
53 are also looking at cameras for strategic areas on campus.

54
55 Campus Police also provides subsidized services for student activities on campus including late
56 night parties at Talley and Campout.

57
58 We take your resolution seriously because we take our job very seriously.

59
60 One of the things we are looking at doing that could use student help since you've requested

61
62 We're looking at 911 cell phone tracking. We will be able to know where you are to about three
63 feet to where you're located. If you have an older phone, it can be done by triangulation and can
64 track you down to fifty feet. What we're asking for is adding an extra \$0.15 next year to your
65 student activities fee. [We'd like your support].

66
67 Sen. Robert Waldrup: How many legit blue light alarms go off during the school year?

68
69 Chief Younce: About a dozen per year. It makes you feel good, and you're parents feel good,
70 it's why we invest in them but other services are more effective.

71
72 Sen. James Hankins: It is my understanding that some students who were in the Technician on
73 the front page had only committed misdemeanors. Do you take into account the

74
75 Chief Younce: Go back and ask a victim of one who had a textbook stolen that they need to
76 study out of. Everyone knew each other and it was a ring.

77
78 Sen. John Mickey: On the other sides of the Reynolds tunnel the light has been out for over a
79 month. Why does it take so long to have it fixed?

80
81 Chief Younce: Facilities is responsible for repairs, but we do follow up on it.

82
83 Sen. Michael Lloyd: On East Campus, there doesn't seem to be the same coverage. Why does it
84 take such an incidence to get the coverage?

85

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86 Chief Younce: We do it based on demand. [Notes that the crimes did occur off campus and
87 coverage has been increased afterwards]. We divide up the campus in “beats.” Smaller ones are
88 on this side of campus, but on Centennial, there is only one for the whole campus. We do a lot
89 just to alleviate

90
91 Unidentified Senator: What are your hot spots out of curiosity?

92
93 Chief Younce: D.H. Hill, Talley and Carmichael are the hotspots. Nelson, Wood Hall, and
94 Tompkins/Caldwell/Winston.

95
96 Sen. Diana Douglas: How often does the safety patrol run? And is it available off campus.

97
98 Chief Younce: It is not, only on campus. It is available from dusk to about 2am.

99
100 Sen. James Hankins: Is it understood that not all students when filling out affidavits and reports
101 aren't trying to hide information. Your office seems in

102

104
105 Ms. Carla Babb: As some of you know already, we're looking to get funding for a band on the
106 last day of classes. At the same time, there will be the Hillsborough Hike. We are in the process
107 of finalizing the band and are looking at locations. Ideally we will have it in the elevated area at
108 the belltower. We are also looking block off the road around that area and detour traffic for foot
109 traffic. Anyone can come out. Ideally we need \$2,500 for the band and additional for publicity
110 and other expenses. We would like to request funding from item 1401. It will be around 8-
111 10pm, everyone is welcome. We're looking at the “Embers.”

112
113 Sen. Robert Waldrup: [Notes concerns with Raleigh residents and our image in the community.
114 Doesn't feel that inebriated and excited students rallying to loud music would be appreciated and
115 should be taken into consideration].

116
117 Mr. Gene Summey: Senior Class t-shirts, you need to buy one.

119 Ms. Carla Babb: The funds will go to

122 SSP Forrest Hinton: With no objection, the Elections Commission will attend the Senate meeting
123 and we will halt our activities regardless of what's going on to let them speak.

126 Sen. Tracy Hutcherson:

128 Fellow Senators, Student Government Leaders, Students, Faculty, Staff, Administration and
129 Guest:

130

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131 I stand before you today as both a Student Senator representing the College of Agriculture and
132 Life Science and a Part-time Student. Part-time Student...that has become a phrase used by Dr.
133 Tom Stafford, the Associate Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs. He has used these two words
134 to deny certain students from voting and running for positions within Student Government. He
135 has used these two words in a despicable manor and not only implying that they are second class
136 students but also treating them as such. A man whose job it is to ensure that "All" students here
137 at NC State have a rich social and cultural time while they attend this university. The largest part
138 of his job is to provide and encourage students to become involved in events, activities, and
139 student lead organizations such as the Union Board of Directors, the Union Activities Board, and
140 Student Government. We now know that he has not only attempted to stop Part-time students
141 from participating in student lead organizations, he even tried to stop Part-time students from
142 voting. That is right, Dr. Tom Stafford, the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs tried to stop
143 over 7,000 students the right to vote on their own student leaders. He also has denied a Part-time
144 student from running for Student Senate. Why you may ask has he now after 20 plus years taken
145 such a stance? He has stated that he has just "recently" "properly" reviewed the Student Body
146 Constitution and sees that it states "full fee" and thus those that do not pay the "full fee" should
147 not be allowed to participate in Student Government. That in my opinion is utterly disgusting
148 and despicable and should show how little he now wishes to truly serve students.

149
150 Now, he undoubtedly will try to retort his original actions, which were not allowing part-time
151 students from participating in student government and not allowing them to vote. He will say
152 that he did finally allow part-time students to vote, but did so with a caveat that Part-time
153 students could not run or be eligible for any position within Student Government. When I heard
154 that he wanted all student who were participating in Student Government to have paid the full
155 fee, I immediately wrote a check in the amount of \$8.85 for the NCSU Student Government Fee.
156 His response was that the "full fee" meant the "full activities fee." Now Part-time student's pay
157 a full-prorated fee based on the number of hours they take. They are allowed to participate in
158 everything...Everything that is but Student Government according to Dr. Stafford.

159

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160 For over 20 years, yes 20 years Part-time students have been allowed to vote and participate in
161 Student Government. Dr Stafford has been at this university for over 30 years, and at no point
162 during that time has he ever voiced a concern about Part-time students participating in student
163 government. In fact, in the 80's the Student Body Constitution was amended to ensure that
164 certain students would be allowed to serve in Student Government. This was done by adding the
165 language "Senators who shall represent" and guess what else was included in that amendment,
166 the words "special students." Thus the seats in our Senate now comprise Life Long Students.
167 By the way, Life Time Students have to obtain permission to take more than 6 hours. They truly
168 are "Part-time."

169
170 Now if he wants to take the view that full fee means full activities fee, he cannot get around the
171 part in our constitution that allows the students the right to change their own constitution. There
172 was a referenda on the ballot to clarify and update many parts of the constitution and part of it
173 dealt with allowing Part-time students the right to participate. Dr Stafford tried to stop the
174 referenda, why, he did not like the fact that if it passed it would allow "All" students Full-time
175 and Part-time to participate in Student Government. As the results of the current election will
176 soon be released, I am sure that you will find that more than 70% of students who voted, voted to
177 change the Student Body Constitution to allow "All" students, both Full-time and Part-time, to
178 participate in any branch of Student Government.

179
180 The true argument of all of this issue lays with Dr Stafford's dislike of me. Being a non-
181 traditional and older student, I do not have a problem questioning the universities actions and any
182 results that they clam to have obtained from some form of survey or possible biased data or
183 statistics. If I feel there is something wrong, I question it. That is the real issue that occurred
184 this election cycle. Dr Stafford stopped an election due to the fact that I was the ballot. Just a
185 few hours before the election, Dr. Stafford ordered the university to shutdown the voting server
186 and thus the students could not cast their votes. Despite the fact that the Elections Commission
187 voted by Acclamation, at three different meetings to allow Part-time Students to run and allow
188 my name to remain on the Ballot, Dr. Stafford ordered the voting server to be shutdown. Once I
189 witnessed Dr. Stafford, Associate Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs, stop a student from

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190 participating in student activities, I knew at that point that he had neither integrity nor any true
191 desire to serve the students. He was willing to stop over 7,000 students their right to vote
192 because he had a personal issue with me. He did not want me, one student, to participate in
193 student government and thus in order to stop me from running he was willing to punish over
194 7,000 students. That shows his true character, or I should say lack of character. To me, he has
195 actively neglected his job as the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs. On his letterhead it states
196 “Students First.” I believe that everyone should now know that he is only willing to serve a
197 select few. He should change his letterhead to read “Full-time Students First.”

198
199 When he shut down the voting server, he then stopped “all” NCSU students from participating
200 and voting during the “Student Body” elections. I was then forced to deal with the facts at hand.
201 Was I willing to have my name removed from the ballot or was I willing to stall the voting
202 process through appealing the actions of Dr. Stafford? Based on my desire to truly serve the
203 students, I removed my name from the ballot. I truly love and want to continue to represent the
204 students in the Student Senate. But I wanted to ensure that all students could vote and thus I did
205 not mind being the sacrificial lamb to ensure that the elections could take place. Every time you
206 see Dr. Stafford, see him as a man, a grown man, who due to his dislike for one student was
207 willing to stop over 7,000 students from voting. After he shutdown the voting server, the
208 election was postponed. He then hands \$50 to each individual that was running for one of the
209 top student body wide elected positions. He stated it came from his own pocket...we will see if
210 he is reimbursed by the university. If the university reimburses him, I will let you know.

211
212 Some have asked why I am not a full-time student and so now I will give you a brief “snap shot”
213 why I am only able to attend or be enrolled as a Part-time student. I served in the US Army for
214 almost 12 years as a Combat Airborne Medical NCO. While Serving in the US Army I received
215 over 35 Certificates of Achievements and Letters of Appreciation and was awarded over 18
216 various medals, one was a Meritorious Service Medal. This was awarded to me by the
217 recommendation of a Brigadier General and approved by a Major General for representing the
218 entire population of the US Army Single Soldiers for one year and adding in the writing of a US
219 Army Policy. The purpose of me representing the US Army Single Soldiers were to identify

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220 issues of concern that impacted the quality of life for Single Soldiers in numerous aspects of their
221 lives and then report them to different Chain Of Commands and to the Department of the Army.
222 We also setup and held Army-Wide conference's for Single Soldier issues and concerns.

223
224 During the last few years of my military service I began to have the following medical problems:
225 left knee pain due to jumping out of planes; tumor in my skull; migraine headaches; high blood
226 pressure; left ear drum 75 % deteriorated; and, I began to have uncontrolled seizures. With all of
227 these medical problems, I could not further advance in the US Army and thus the US Department
228 of Veterans Affairs has listed me as being 100% service connected disabled. I have had 3
229 surgeries on my left knee, 7 surgeries on my left ear and skull, and I am pending one to two other
230 surgeries. During my time in the Army and since I was "Honorably Discharged," I have spent at
231 total of at least 5 months in the hospital and at least 3 months of medical leave. To "combat" all
232 of these medical issues, now, each day, I must take at least 22 different types of medication to
233 simply function. Due to all of this, I was and am still advised by my Neurologist, my VA
234 Vocation Rehabilitation Counselor, and Advisor to take no more than 6 hours of course work. I
235 am not complaining. These problems do not define me...they are just an aspect of my life.
236 Everyone has their own issues and the ones that I just listed are what I must endure. With all of
237 this combined, I can only take up to 6 hours and that is what I will do. Not to follow my doctors,
238 counselors, and advisors advice would be "un-prudent." I participate in Student Government to
239 represent students regardless if they are Full-time or Part-time.

240
241 When I first entered the Student Senate I was impressed by Dr. Stafford, now I know his true
242 character and worth to students and both of these are lacking in substance. Once again, I ask that
243 when you see Dr. Stafford, know that he stopped the election of Student Leaders due to his
244 dislike of one student. When he speaks and makes a promise to students, remember that he
245 attempted to not allow 7,000 Part-time students to vote on their leaders. Remember these and the
246 others I have mentioned.

247
248 During the 82nd, 83rd, 84th, and 85th Sessions: I have sponsored or co-sponsored over 57 pieces of
249 legislation; attended at least 58 Senate meetings; attended at least 152 Committee meetings; and,

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250 have served on 8 different committee's (Committee on Appropriations, Committee on Campus
251 Community, Committee on Diversity, Committee on Government Operations, Committee on
252 Rules and Calendar, Select Committee on Appointments; Select Committee on Executive
253 Organization, and Select Committee on Government Simplification).

254
255 With all of this, I feel that I have served my college, the College of Agricultural and Life
256 Sciences. I have enjoyed serving the students of NCSU in the Student Senate for four years and
257 have met some wonderful people. While one administrator may not let me hold a position in the
258 Student Senate, I will still be attending both Senate and Committee meetings. If at anytime, any
259 Senator needs any help with writing legislation or research, please feel free to contact me. Once
260 again, I wish to thank the student in CALS for placing their trust in me and voting for me during
261 my tenure in the Student Senate.

262
263 And in closing please remember that "Service is Leadership." Thank you all, Full-time Student
264 Senator and Part-time Student Tracy S. Hutcherson.
